

MARINE CORPS BASE CAMP BLAZ, GUAM

Marine Corps Base Camp Blaz (MCBCB) serves as a strategic logistics hub positioned to bolster regional security and stability in the Indo-Pacific. Access to this installation is restricted to ensure security of assets, ultimately preserving their warfighting capability. Access to this site is authorized for Department of Defense (DoD) card carrying personnel (Active Duty personnel and their family members, Guard and Reserve members and their family, DoD civilians, DoD Support Contractors, Veterans who are issued a Veteran's Health Identification Card (VHIC), and other personnel who have a bonified reason for base access and are issued a Defense Biometric Identification System (DBIDS) credential). The Installation Commanding Officer (ICO) retains the authority to revise access procedures as required.

Base Access Requirements:



Active Duty/Reserves/Guardsmen/DoD Civilians/Armed Forces Retirees:

- Access via issued Common Access Card (CAC) or Retiree ID card.
- Authorized to sponsor up to seven (7) unescorted and three
 (3) escorted guests upon DBIDS pass issuance at NBG VCC. No Trusted Traveler Program.



Dependents of Active Duty, Reserves, Guardsmen:

- Access visa issued DoD ID Card.
- If over 18 years old, authorized to sponsor up to seven (7) unescorted guests upon DBIDS pass issuance at NBG VCC.



DoD Civilian Retiree with Valid DoD Identification

- These individuals have limited access to the installation.
- Retired civilian employees can bring their SF-50 and be issued a DBIDS card at the NBG VCC.
- They have access to the following: Morale, Welfare, and Recreation (MWR) Fitness Facility. Navy Exchange (Online only)

Not able to sponsor guests.

Purple Heart Recipients, Former Prisoners of War, Veterans with service-connected disabilities/VHIC

- Authorized access via authorized credential.
- VHIC with Service Connected Disabilities annotated on the VHIC may escort up to seven (7) unescorted and three (3) escorted guests upon vetting at NBG VCC.



Contractors

- Access to the installation via the CAC or DBIDS credential.
- Can not sponsor anyone onto the installation.

Note: Regardless of status, "Trusted Traveler" is not authorized aboard MCB Camp Blaz.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

Q: Is access to Marine Corps Base Camp Blaz services open to everyone?

A: No, access to services is restricted to authorized patrons only.

Q: Who can use the services at Marine Corps Base Camp Blaz?

A: Usage is based on your DoD ID card status, and your affiliation with the installation.

Q: I am an active duty or a DoD civilian with orders. What services can I access?

A: You are eligible for access and all services at the base.

Q: I am the dependent of active duty or DoD civilian personnel on transportation agreement and I am listed on their orders. Can I access services?

A: Yes, you are eligible for access and all services at the base.

Q: I am a dependent visiting an unaccompanied active-duty sponsor who is permanently attached to Marine Corps Base Camp Blaz . Can I access services?

A: A: Yes, you are eligible for access and all services at the base.

Q: I am a Department of Defense civilian on leave with a valid DoD-ID. Can I access services?

A: Yes, you are eligible for access and all authorized services at the base.

Q: I am a retiree with a valid DoD-ID. Can I access services?

A: Military Retiree: Yes, you are eligible for access and all services at the base.

A: <u>DoD Civilian Retiree</u>: Yes, you are eligible for access; but limited access to services: MWR facilities and NEX (online only).

Q: I am a reservist on orders. Can I access services?

A: Reservists/Guardsmen: Yes, you have the same access and privileges as active duty personnel.

Q: I am a reservist, not on orders. Can I access services?

A: Reservists/Guardsmen: Yes, you are eligible for access and all services at the base.

Q: I have a different situation. Who can I contact for more information?

A: Please contact the Naval Base Guam (NBG) Visitor Control Center (VCC) for further assistance.

Q: I am active duty stationed onboard Marine Corps Base Camp Blaz and want to invite my parents to visit me on base. Is that allowed?

A: Yes, you are authorized to sponsor up to seven (7) unescorted and three (3) escorted guests at a time, upon vetting at NBG VCC.

Note: Trusted traveler is not in effect at MCB Camp Blaz. Guests are authorized to visit via a DBIDS visitor pass issued by the NBG VCC, recommended 10-15 days in advanced of visit. All guests are required to complete SECNAV Form 5512/1 and pass background fitness check.
